Location:

The Intern will serve primarily in Montezuma and Dolores Counties of the San Juan Basin region in Southwest Colorado. This unique area of the Four Corners of Colorado is rich in cultural heritage, agriculture lifestyles and natural beauty for outdoor enthusiasts.

Internship Experience:

This internship will provide learning opportunities for an individual to gain real world experience in a variety of community engagement projects. These projects will have a focus in Community Food Systems, Food Security, and Rural Economic Development initiatives. In addition, there will be a strong emphasis in developing community partnerships with underserved populations in our area.
