- 4) Proposed internship goals, scope, and objectives:
 - a. Goal: The student intern will create an additional digital repository webpage for ten historic Colorado
 architectural buildings located in Central City, Colorado on the CSU-AVL website:
 https://www.chhs.colostate.edu/dm/programs-and-degrees/galleries-libraries-and-laboratories/architectural-virtual-library/
 - b. Scope: The method for obtaining this goal will be to complete one building per week over ten weeks.
 - c. Objectives:
 - 1. O.1 determine (with mentor guidance) which historic buildings to highlight on the Central City webpage;
 - 2. O.2 utilize 360 video <u>camera</u> capabilities to capture virtual tour content of buildings via <u>Matterport</u>;
 - 3. O.3 research historic building information and embed the research into the tours via Mattertags;
 - 4. O.4 integrate <u>inclusive website principles</u> in all webpage content;
 - 5. O.5 present to community stakeholders.
- 5) Research project identification: As COVID-19 has deterred students from touring historic buildings, the goal of the webpage is to host virtual historic building tours to promote architectural education to students in K-12 programs (however, the website will be open to all). A virtual reality 360 camera will capture the building footage. Additionally, the virtual tours will include historical descriptions of each building.

 - 4. O.4 how to integrate <u>inclusive website principles</u> in all webpage content.
 - 5. O.5 presentation skills to community stakeholders.

Opportunities for professional development include: the student intern will present their project to the (a) city of Central City, (b) teachers in the Central City school, and (c) community members. The student will practice networking, building relationships, and gain experience by sharing research findings in a public speaking format.
