CSU Extension Internship Program




The CSU Extension Internship Program was started in 2018 following a request from Extension leadership to find opportunities to facilitate enhanced connections between campus and field, as well as students and Extension. In addition, there was a call to ensure that applied research conducted by CSU faculty better met the needs of Colorado stakeholders and that Extension better communicated research opportunities.

The CSU Extension Internship Program is different from other internship programs at CSU. Internships are based in Colorado, include applied research, significant time in the field and support stakeholder engagement with regional or county-based Extension specialists. In addition to specific internship goals, interns, from any college at CSU, glean an understanding of the complexities of working across state, county, and university constructs and how to marry varying perspectives toward a common goal. Extension mentors benefit from the program through enhanced connections to campus, including facilitating better relationships with faculty on issues important to Coloradoans.



Interns

- 94% of interns would recommend this internship to a friend.

- 100% of interns now have a better understanding of how research can be applied in communities.
- 85% of interns now have a better understanding of how to engage stakeholders in research.


Mentors (Faculty)

- 87% of Faculty Mentors increasingly see value in engaging stakeholders in research.
- 75% of Faculty Mentors now better understand how research can be applied in communities.
- 87% of Faculty Mentors feel more connected to agents in the field.
- 96% of Faculty Mentors recommend participating in the CSU Summer Extension Internship program to other faculty members and Extension personnel.
- 95% of Faculty Mentors are likely to participate in the CSU Summer Extension Internship program again.

Mentors (Extension)

- 80% of Extension Mentors increasingly see value in engaging stakeholders in research.
- 64% of Extension Mentors feel more connected to campus and to other agents in the field.
- 96% of Extension Mentors recommend participating in the CSU Summer Extension Internship program to other faculty members and Extension personnel.
